

**RESOLUTION APPROVING FORM AND INSTITUTION OF
SEWER USE RESOLUTION**

WHEREAS, the North Hudson Sewerage Authority (hereinafter "Authority") is a public body, duly formed under the Sewerage Authorities law, constituting Chapter 138 of the Laws of New Jersey of 1946, as amended (Chapter 14A of Title 40 of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated) and possesses the powers set forth therein; and

WHEREAS, this is a resolution intended to set forth uniform guidelines applicable to all discharges into the NHSA combined system in conformity with all applicable State of New Jersey and Federal Laws pertaining to same; and

WHEREAS, these guidelines are designed to conform to all requirements of the LTCP, establish policies prohibiting the introduction of pollutants into the NHSA collection that would interfere with normal operation of the treatment works or pass through the treatment works into receiving water bodies, summarize NHSA policies and procedures for administration of new connections including the technical requirements and review process in a single reference document and establish uniform requirements for new sewer connections and to reduce the impact of peak stormwater flow from all discharges into the system; and

WHEREAS, the within sewer use resolution was proffered by Mott McDonald as outside consulting engineers as in the best interest of NHSA to ensure compliance with all state discharge permit requirements and in furtherance of its LTCP; and

WHEREAS, the proposed sewer use resolution has been reviewed by NHSA general counsel and found to be in satisfactory form and in the best interests of NHSA, its continuing operations and the safety of its treatment and collection systems; and

WHEREAS, the Facilities Review Board has reviewed the proposed Sewer Use Resolution and recommends its approval to ensure permit compliance, operational efficiencies and protection of capital investment in NHSA's treatment and collections systems.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Authority, as recommended by the Facilities Review Board, approves of the Sewer Use Resolution as outlined in Exhibit "A

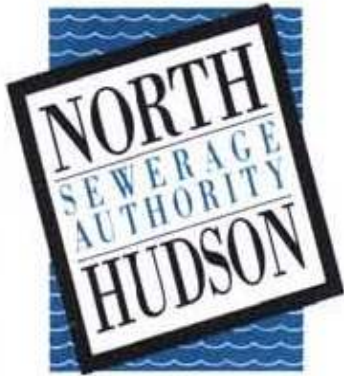

Sewer Use Resolution Executive Summary:

The enclosed Sewer Use Resolution is intended to set forth uniform guidelines applicable to all discharges into the NHTA combined sewer system in conformity all applicable State and Federal laws. Specifically, these guidelines are designed to:

- Conform with the requirements of the Long Term Control Plan,
- Establish formal policies prohibiting the introduction of pollutants into the NHTA Collection System that would interfere with the normal operation of the Treatment Works or pass through the Treatment Works into receiving water bodies,
- Summarize NHTA policies and procedures for the administration of new connections, including the technical requirements and review process in a single reference document.
- Establish uniform requirements for new sewer connections which will reduce impacts of peak stormwater flow from all dischargers into the system.

The standards detailed in this document include limits to the type and concentration of discharge entering into the NHTA combined sewer system, Fats Oil and Grease (FOG) system and stormwater management system Operation and Maintenance Standards, Procedures for Metering and Estimating wastewater flows, technical requirements for new sewer connections, discharge and reporting requirements of Industrial Dischargers.

A significant change to the connection requirements will be the use of an online tool for determining the stormwater storage requirements in lieu of a stormwater management report. This will increase the storage requirements for all developers connecting to the NHSA system and require automatic valves in lieu of passively controlled stormwater systems for some of the stormwater systems.

This document shall replace several existing documents on the NHSA website including the Sewer Connection and Review Checklist, Sewer Connection Application Procedures, and Sewer Connection Guidelines.
